As a student, if I want information about a class, I have to go to its particular course website. Due dates and test dates might be arranged in a list or a calendar. For additional information on these events, I have to go another page on the course website. And then I have to repeat this process three or four times for each class I'm taking to compile all this information into a planner. This is a lot of scattered information.

What if I could have one calendar, online, where teachers send information to all of their students regarding class schedules. The teachers organize their classes on this website rather than on their personal websites, and so I get information about each of my classes on just one web page. How would this look like? I see a quiz on Friday. A test on Monday. A review session of Tuesday. I can scroll over to see additional information...

Applied to students at any school level, from elementary school to grad school. It's good for students, great for parents who want to know what's going on in their children's schools, and perfect for teachers who are sick of hearing excuses of why students forgot an assignment was due.
